Lenten Book

The calendar has turned to January, 2025. On the church calendar, during December 2024, we celebrated the Advent season, which means "coming". We remember Jesus' coming to be a sacrifice for our sins, focusing our hearts on Him during the busyness of the Christmas. The next season on the church calendar is Lent, followed by Easter.

Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday (March 5, 2025) and ends on Holy Thursday (April 17, 2025). Lent comes from the Anglo-Saxon word lencten, which means "spring." The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry.

Sundays in Lent are not counted in the forty days because each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter" and the reverent spirit of Lent is tempered with joyful anticipation of the Resurrection.

Members of the Washington Cooperative Parish will once again come together to meditate on an assigned Scripture from the Lectionary, pray over the reading, and write as God leads. These writings will be put together in a book, to be read during the season of Lent. Details are being finalized, and more information will be forthcoming. Please be open to being a Lenten book writer. This ministry is powerful and helpful.
