

"They are like a man building a house, who dug down deep and laid the foundation on rock. When a flood came, the torrent struck that house but could not shake it, because it was well built." (Luke 6:48)

"Consequently, you are no longer foreigners and strangers, but fellow citizens with God's people and also members of his household, built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the chief cornerstone. In him the whole building is joined together and rises to become a holy temple in the Lord." (Ephesians 2:19-21)

When we begin a new year there is often a focus on letting go of the old and embracing the new - new you, new routines, new habits, new diet, new spiritual disciplines and so on. While this can be a good way to focus for a new year, I've been thinking about how simply because something is new doesn't mean it's good and the best next thing. We don't need a new car, new phone, new clothes, new everything all the time simply because it's shiny and new - this can lead to greed, envy and other brokenness. Also, have you ever gotten a "new" device or update to your phone and it immediately has problems because all the kinks and bugs haven't been worked out yet?? See, just because something is new doesn't mean it's good and we need it.

Perhaps in this new year, we might instead consider focusing on the old - the traditions, the foundations, the cornerstones - that are solid, trustworthy, strong, steadfast and ever present. Perhaps, we might pause to remember the foundations of our faith that make us who we are - as individuals, as churches, as a denomination, as Christians - and seek to cling to them, nurture them, strengthen their presence in our daily lives.

Who are the people that have shaped us in the faith? What are the practices and traditions that have brought us closer to God and strengthened our faith? What are the scriptures that fill us with hope? Which ones challenge us, how might we pray more fervently as we study them and seek to hear God's voice? Where does God's justice that the prophets speak of, need to break through? How might our faith move us to action?

This doesn't mean that change or "new-ness" isn't needed or beneficial, but rather that "new" is not the focus as we begin this new year. Finding new ways to connect with God, to pray, to serve, to meet the needs of our neighbors can all be holy and beautiful for ministry and mission in 2025. But, only if they lead to love of God and love of neighbor, which are built on the foundations of our faith - on the old, ancient stories and witness of prophets, priests, saints, apostles who have shared the faith for generations. Faith is the focus. Christ is the focus. Loving God and loving neighbor is the focus.

As we begin 2025, may you find love, hope, peace and joy in the presence of God the Father, Jesus Christ our Savior, and the Holy Spirit. May you enter into the new year with hearts open and ready to 'go and make disciples for the transformation of the world'! And if this includes new practices and ways of being, letting go, connecting to God and others - please do it with great excitement and commitment to all that God can and will do in and through you! (I'm really not saying new can't be good in the new year!)

But, more than anything, may our new year be focused on what makes us who we are in Christ - the cornerstone of our faith. May we find strength in this foundation as we weather new storms and challenges that 2025 may bring. May we find peace and comfort in this steadfast love and presence of God that never fades away as we face all that 2025 will bring. May we find joy in the same old good news of Jesus Christ, that gives us not simply new, but abundant life now and forevermore!


